All Camps and clubs will include hands-on activities that promote exploration and discovery.

Hands-on Activities

◆ Animal Art Camp and Shapes in Art

These two programs focus on pre-emergent writing and reading skills as students learn colors, shapes, and letters through art.

◆ Code Breaking Academy

Code breaking is a skill that requires reading and mathematics skills. Students will crack codes and solve crimes as they become mathematical and reading spies.

◆ Game Time and Athletic Programs

Students participate in different games that promote teamwork, hard work, and sportsmanship. The games include athletic sports like basketball, but also board games, common card games, games of strategy like chess.

◆ Garden Club

A little bit of art, a little bit of cooking, a little bit of gardening, a lot of fun.

This club explores gardens by designing and creating a garden. Students are immersed in art, mythology, organic cooking, and even develop math skills as they learn about gardens.

◆ Hiking and the Great Outdoors

Arizona has an amazing history and while the summers can get a little too hot to enjoy the outdoors during the day, learning about different plants that can be used as a source of food, common animals found in Arizona, and basic camping and survival techniques can make hiking with friends and family more rewarding.

◆ Music, Movement, and S.T.E.A.M. Projects

Music and movement go hand in hand as children learn some dance moves, while singing their favorite songs.

◆ Nursery Rhymes and Games

Finger puppets, silly stories, songs, and games are included as students learn about different nursery rhymes and play games that will develop their literacy skills.

◆ Rock 'N Water

Fun in the sun must include water. Rock 'N Water allows the students to explore water in its many forms. This includes making snow cones, learning about the water cycle, exploring fluidity in music and dance, and just having fun.

◆ S.T.E.A.M. Projects

Child centered activities based on real-world situations. Students will explore various topics, find solutions to real-world problems, and create prototypes of inventions or tools that could be used to solve these problems.

◆ Young Bengals Performing Arts Programs

Students will perform dramatic performances that increase literacy skills and reading fluency. They will focus on working together as a team to put on an amazing performance.
